### Selections for the fifth term of membership to the GCF Board, 2025-2027

Your Excellency Mr. Fatumanava-o-Upolu III Dr Pa'olelei Luteru,

As the current fourth term membership of the Green Climate Fund (GCF) Board will expire on 31 December 2024, the Secretariat of the GCF, in its capacity as depository of the selection of members of the GCF Board, would like to bring to the attention of the Chairs and Coordinators of regional groups and constituencies1 the process for the selection of Board members and alternate members for the fifth term membership of the Board, which will cover the period from 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2027.

In this connection, the selection of the members of the Board and their alternates will be made by their respective constituency or regional group within a constituency. The notification shall be made as follows:

- In the case of developed country Parties, the notification shall be made by the developed country Party or group of these that the member(s) represent, as determined by the constituency. In recent practice, the notification has been made by the Co-Chair of the GCF Board representing the developed constituency.
- In the case of the developing country Parties, the notification shall be made by the corresponding regional group. In practice, the notification has been made by the Chair or Coordinator of the concerned regional group.

Please note that the notification to the Secretariat of the Board of the members and alternate members selected for the term 2025-2027 shall be made in writing and be directed via e-mail to Mr. Artur Cardoso de Lacerda, Secretary to the Board and Director of Governance Affairs, (SecretarytotheBoard@gcfund.org), It shall be transmitted to the Secretariat before 30 September 2024, and include:

- the name(s) and contact details of the member(s); and
- the name(s) and contact details of the alternate member(s).

## Annex I: Board composition: main provisions of GCF Governing Instrument and the Rules of Procedure of the Board

In accordance with paragraphs 9 and 10 of the Governing Instrument for the GCF ("Governing Instrument"), "the Board will have 24 members, composed of an equal number of members from developing and developed country Parties. (...)", and "[e]ach Board member will have an alternate member (...)".

Paragraph 12 of the Governing Instrument specifies that "[m]embers and alternate members will serve for a term of three years and be eligible to serve additional terms as determined by their constituency".

Paragraph 4 of the Rules of Procedure of the Board ("Rules of Procedure") sets out that "[f]or each new term, pursuant to paragraph 11 of the Governing Instrument, the selection and notification to the Secretariat of the Board member or alternate member shall be made by the developed or developing country Party or group of these that the Board member or alternate member represents as determined by the constituency in the case of the developed country Parties, or by his or her respective regional group consistent with paragraph 3 above in the case of the developing country Parties."

Paragraph 3 of the Rules of Procedure sets out that "[the] representation on the Board from developing country Parties will include:

- (1) Three members and alternate members from the Asia-Pacific States;
- (2) Three members and alternate members from the African States;
- (3) Three members and alternate members from the Latin American and the Caribbean States;
- (4) One member and alternate member from small island developing States;
- (5) One member and alternate member from least developed country Parties; and
- (6) One member from developing country Parties not included in the regional groups and constituencies above; and one alternate member to rotate between developing country Parties included in the groups and constituencies listed above".

Pursuant to paragraph 11 of the Governing Instrument, "[t]he members of the Board and their alternates will be selected by their respective constituency or regional group within a constituency. Members of the Board will have the necessary experience and skills, notably in the areas of climate change and development finance, with due consideration given to gender balance".



### Annex II: Fifth term of Board membership selection process

#### Message on new term

•The GCF Secretariat issues a letter to Chairs and Coordinators of regional groups and constituencies and informs on the selection process for the fifth term Board membership. (June 2024)

### Selection of members

•Chairs and Coordinators of regional groups and constituencies consult with Parties in their relevant groups/constituencies, to agree on the selections. (June-September 2024)

### Notification of selection

•Chairs and coordinators of regional groups and constituencies notify the GCF Secretariat in writing of the names and contact details of the selected Board and alternate members. (before 30 September 2024)

### Update Board and COP

•The Secretariat updates the Board on the status of selections received during the fortieth meeting of the Board (October 2024). The Board informs the COP on the selections for the term 2025-2027 through the addendum of the Thirteenth Report to the COP (November 2024).

### New membership

•The GCF Secretariat updates its membership records reflecting the new Board membership (1 January 2025).
